Corpus Christi

First Reading: Exodus 24:3-8

Second Reading: Hebrews 9:11-15

Gospel: Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

We celebrate today the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ or Corpus Christi. Before anything else, we ask, “Are not the masses we celebrate everyday and every week-end, not a celebration of the Body and Blood of Christ? Have we not highlighted this feast on Holy Thursday before the Passion of the Lord? Why is there a need for another feast when we have all these celebrations?”

On Holy Thursday, we celebrate the institution of the Holy Eucharist, the institution of the Sacrament of Holy Orders and the Washing of the Feet. The Gospel of that day spoke about the washing of the feet and its relationship to the Holy Eucharist and to the Sacrament of Holy Orders.

A feast of the Body and Blood of Christ affords us the opportunity to give collective thanks for Christ’s abiding presence with us which is made visible in the Eucharist. The Eucharist is not a sign or a symbol of the Body and Blood of Christ; **it is the Body and Blood of Christ.** While the form of bread and wine remains, the substance is Jesus and therefore, Jesus in the Eucharist is to be honored with the worship of adoration. This is the doctrine of “transubstantiation”. In the Anglican and Episcopal Church, they believe that Jesus is present in the Eucharist only during their mass for some others who tried to adopt the distribution of Holy Communion, the bread remains bread and is just a sign and a symbol. For us Catholics, it contains (important word here is ‘contains’) the body and blood of Jesus for He, Himself, said: “Take it, this is my body; this is my blood of the new covenant.”

For this reason, the Church asks all those who receive Holy Communion to make a gesture of respectful worship as a profound bow or genuflection before receiving the Eucharist because they are about to receive the King of kings and the Lord of lords. And, if we receive the Eucharist with our hands, we should make a throne and a footstool for the King with one palm over the other. But before receiving, each of us needs to prepare a fitting place for Christ within ourselves, because each of us is called to be a living tabernacle. This awesome reality of who Christ is in the Eucharist should also lead us to a profound thanksgiving every time we have received the Lord. I always wonder whether those who leave Mass after having received the Lord have ever uttered a prayer of thanks. The Lord in the Eucharist makes the Eucharist more important, much more important than anything else we might want to do after the Mass. So don’t rush out after Mass.

Let us therefore approach the Eucharist with a more lively faith in Jesus who is really present with and to us in the form of bread and wine in order for us to experience God’s saving and transforming love.

Then can we become what we receive in the Eucharist: we become Christ to one another by being ourselves bearers of Christ who is Bread, Broken and Shared.

Cast into the Deep

A Story of Conversion through the Eucharist Fr. Rolly Astudillo

In the United States, the Catholic Church has a long history of catechetical instruction that led many to a path of conversion through the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults and eventually to a life of participation in the celebration of the Paschal Mystery and consequently, to discipleship.

Our Lady of Lourdes Parish is no stranger to this phenomenon. At every Easter Vigil Celebration, we find adults being fully initiated into full communion with the Catholic Church together with young people and children. For the adults, Jim Lank has been ardently facilitating the RCIA program with lessons on Catholic Church doctrines on Faith and Morals, our Apostolic origin, the importance of communion with God and with one another in prayer and the Sacraments with the Eucharist as the source and summit of the Christian life.

It can be very interesting to know of the paths that God chooses for these converts' lives in many mysterious ways. Most of the salient points of their stories began somewhere with someone telling their own stories about the Catholic Church: a spouse, a friend or even a stranger. Yet many are not certain on where to begin.

Here is the story of a young man in search of himself with no intention of being a Catholic. I met this young man in my first Parish assignment in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. That was more than 10 years ago when I came to the Archdiocese after being a priest in the Philippines for sixteen and a half years. Let's call him John.

John was a son of a pastor of one of the small Christian churches that we may find on any small corner in our cities. He has Catholic friends with whom he goes along, even to Sunday worship in Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal Church along Garfield in Montebello where I was then the Associate Pastor. He was about 40 years old.

On one St. Joseph's Feast (March 19), where parishioners gather together for dinner and fellowship, I sat with his friends who introduced him to me. For some reason, I remember him telling me that it seemed wrong to him for two pastors, his dad and I, preaching different meanings to the same scripture passage. To him, if we were all part of the same faith, shouldn't the teachings be the same? It also seemed to him that faith should be more than a Sunday activity as it seemed to be for many.

His friends and I introduced him into the RCIA program of the parish. From his first day in RCIA, he was thrilled about the idea of attending Church again with his friends. After some time, I didn't see him in RCIA again. But soon after, he would be coming to Church alone and be seated at the back pew. There, while waiting for Mass to start, he had the distinct feeling that there was indeed someone present. Someone, other than the parishioners, the priest and the deacon was present. He knew in his heart that God was indeed present. He tried to do what everyone was doing and went up to receive communion as if he were Catholic. As he received the Sacred Body of the Lord and His Precious Blood, he was almost like being struck by lightning; it was an experience he had never had before and was totally unprepared for it. He managed to make it through Mass mainly by imitating the words and actions of the people near him.

After Mass ended, he stuck around and waited for me to have a free moment. He explained to me that when he stopped coming to RCIA, there was that inner longing to come back. He told me that he believed that God wanted him to come to our Church that morning. But since RCIA was on a summer break, I told him to return in the Fall. On Easter Vigil of the following year, he was one of nine adults who received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist. Not soon after, he spoke with the choir director who was thrilled at the prospect of gaining another tenor. Two years after, he was admitted to the Knights of Columbus and had since been honored with ex-emplification to the fourth degree. He has finally come home in the Catholic Church.
