**Come, O Holy Spirit, Come**

## *Pentecost Sunday*

**First Reading: Acts 2:1-11**  
**Second Reading: Romans 8:8-17**  
**Gospel: John 20:19-23**

Today, we come to the high point of our Easter celebrations. It's Pentecost Sunday. Pentecost, meaning 50 days after Easter. This day coincides with a very old and traditional Jewish feast which commemorated the arrival of Israel near Mt. Sinai. Remember what happened on Mt. Sinai: Moses met God and God gave him the law. By saying therefore that the apostles received the Holy Spirit on Pentecost Day, the gospel writers are teaching us that the Holy Spirit had become the new law of Christians and that they are no longer bound by the Jewish law as Jesus is the new Moses giving us the law through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Our daily personal efforts to spread the reign of love and justice may be lightweight or weightless. But by heaping our efforts together we shall eventually be able to break the heavy branch of sin, evil and injustice growing in our world today.

Today, Pentecost Sunday is called the birthday of the Church. It was on the Church assembled in the upper room that God sent His Spirit. As the first reading tells us, Christ's followers were all together in one place. The spirit gives different gifts to different members of the Church so we can help each other to know and experience God and His love. Hence, if we want to experience the fullness of the Spirit, we need each other; we need to come together as a Church, to worship together, to share our gifts with one another.

The Bible tells us that fifty days after exodus, Moses received the Ten Commandments from Yahweh at Mt. Sinai. Yahweh presented these to His people and the people pledged faithfulness to all that Yahweh expected of them. We Christians, celebrate Pentecost fifty days after the resurrection of Jesus. It is the Feast of the Holy Spirit and the Birth of the Church for Jesus sent His Spirit over the disciples to empower them to live by His word. That is why today we are celebrating the Solemnity of Pentecost or the giving and coming of the Holy Spirit as a gift from the Risen Lord. Pentecost means, in Greek, the 50<sup>th</sup> day that is, the 50<sup>th</sup> day after Easter or the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.

Actually, the Holy Spirit was already given to the disciples when Jesus appeared to them after the resurrection. He breathed upon them the Holy Spirit by saying: "Receive the Holy Spirit... do not be afraid." But still, they remained sad and afraid that what happened to Jesus Christ might also happen to them. It was only after 50 days that the apostles finally realized that the Holy Spirit did, indeed, descend upon them and they became courageous.

We too received the Holy Spirit during our Baptism and Confirmation. But why does he not change our lives as He changed that of the apostles? Why do we behave in many ways as if we have never received the Holy Spirit? I guess because the Holy Spirit inspires us to do good things but in the long run it's up to us to accept, ignore and reject His promptings.

In my personal experience, I was introduced to the Holy Spirit when my parents taught me how to make the sign of the cross: "In the name of the father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." So at the early age of my life, I was already introduced to the Persons of the Blessed Trinity especially the Holy Spirit. As I grew up I forgot the Holy Spirit but I always remember the Father and the Son. Yet the Holy Spirit has played a big role in my life.

It is because he is the One who leads me as a sinner to repentance in order to be in communion with those who have been forgiven. He is the One who enlightens me in order to bear witness to the truth of the Gospel; He is the One who turns the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ. He is my conscience and many more.

Even in my prayers, I seldom asked the guidance of the Holy Spirit. You probably also do what I have done – forgetting the Holy Spirit. Now, during my prayer, I always see to it that I should not forget to pray to the Holy Spirit.

To tell you frankly, whenever I am asked to lead a prayer or invocation, I say: 'Come Holy Spirit.' The Holy Spirit is our only Guide, besides others who are inspired by Him to guide too and no more. That is why Christ gave Him to us as a gift because he knew that the Holy Spirit would not fail Him. He will not teach us another new teaching but of Christ's.

To conclude, join me in praying this Prayer to the Holy Spirit: "Come, Holy Spirit fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth Your Spirit and they shall be created, and you shall renew the face of the earth."

It is in the ordinariness of life that we share more fully in the greatest of God's gifts. So as we face the difficulties and trials of our earthly journey, we should rejoice that the Holy Spirit is ever present, enlightening our mind with hope and gradually forming Christ in us. Then can we say, "Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love."

## Cast into the Deep

### Happy Birthday -- Reflections on the Church Nelle Orsburn



During our OLL pilgrimage to the Holy Land five years ago, one of our stops was the Upper Room or the Cenacle. While we were there, I closed my eyes and imagined Jesus and His apostles at the Last Supper. I could almost hear Jesus giving his last instructions, “Love one another as I have loved you...”; “... I am the Way...”; “If you love me you will keep my commandments...”; “I will not leave you orphan...”; “the Advocate the Holy Spirit ... will teach you.. remind you of everything that I have said.” After Jesus ascended to Heaven, the apostles returned to this Upper Room. I pictured them huddled, a little lost maybe, for Jesus whose footsteps they literally followed for three years was gone from their sight; but hopeful because they believed in his promises. I could almost hear the swoosh of the wind as I saw with my mind’s eye the Holy Spirit descending on the Apostles and those gathered with them in tongues of fire on Pentecost Day. They must have been so moved by the Spirit that they did not hesitate to leave the comfort and security of the Upper Room in order to proclaim the Good News to the people of Jerusalem. We read in the Acts of the Apostles that, “Those who accepted his message were baptized and about three thousand persons were added that day” (Acts 2:41).

And so, the Church was born founded by Jesus on the Apostles and their successors, inspired and sustained by the Holy Spirit.

“He who listens to you, listens to me..” (Luke 10:16). We see the role of the hierarchy of the Church in these words of Jesus. The Pope and the Bishops (the Magisterium) hold the teaching office of the Church. We can be assured that when the Pope speaks and when the Bishops speak in union with one another and with the Pope, definitively, on matters of faith and morals, they are speaking in the name of Jesus.

Perhaps, one may think that the hierarchy, the clergy is the Church. In fact, for the longest time, everything seemed to revolve around the clergy. But Vatican II affirmed that the Church is the People of God, not only the hierarchy but also the laity, you and I and all those around us. We are the Church. Through faith and baptism, we become the People of God. We may have our own tasks, Pope, bishop, priest, laity, lay minister, etc. But all of us together are the People of God, are Church.

To be Church is to live as Jesus taught us. Didn’t he say that the Holy Spirit will come to teach us, to remind us

of everything that he had said? Thus, to be Church is to live a gospel-based life. It is not enough to share the Word by speaking. We share the Word by living. We share the lived Word.

In one of Jesus’ last instructions, he said, “I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another” (John 13:34-35). We, the Church, are called to live in mutual love not because the other is lovable, not because it comes naturally to us to love, but because God loved us first and we want to respond to this love by doing His Will. “Love one another. *As I have loved you...*”

Then we can truly speak of the Church as Communion--the People of God, both the ordained and the laity, having the Holy Spirit, listening and being guided by the Holy Spirit, made one by living in mutual love. This, never more so than when we celebrate the Eucharist and receive the body and blood of Christ. We are transformed into Jesus, “we are united in Christ. We are brothers and sisters in Christ. We are the family of God. We are Church.” (Cast into the Deep, July 1, 2018)

Our parish, Our Lady of Lourdes, is a small piece of the Church where God wants us to live our Christianity every day. This is where God calls us to live His Word. Therefore, in everything we do, at home, in school, in the church, in our community, we can always remember to love. Are you proclaiming the Word? Do it out of love for God and the ones who listen. Are you arranging the flowers or dressing the altar? Do it out of love for God and for the people in the pews whose worship is enhanced by the beauty of God in the environment.

The best manifestation of love is to serve. Think of all the myriad ways that we can serve one another, starting with something as simple as a smile that can give a sense of well-being to the other.

Today we celebrate the Descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles. Today we celebrate the birthday of the Church. By virtue of our Baptism we are called to be the People of God. Every invitation requires a response. Will we stay in our “upper room” or will we allow the Holy Spirit to work in us and through us to be Church.

## **Memo form the Office of the Regional Bishop, Alex Acian, San Fernando Pastoral Region, Archdiocese of Los Angeles**

The State Legislature is considering a bill to regulate the Sacrament of Penance and force priests to break the Seal of Confession. It would make the same demands on similar religious practices by other faiths and denominations in California. The bill is referred to as SB 360 by state Sen. Jerry Hill (D-San Mateo). The motivation for the bill is noble, to uncover and stop the abuse of children, but SB 360 would make it a crime if a priest heard the confession of a child abuse victim or a child abuser and failed to break the Seal of Confession to report what they heard in the Confessional to law enforcement.

Confession and Penance are central to the practice of our Catholic faith. Confession to Catholics is an act where a person reveals his conscience to God, hoping to receive God's Mercy. It helps us prepare to receive the Eucharist and to participate fully in our faith. It reminds us and tangibly shows us the power of God's Love.

SB 360 was amended in committee to reduce its scope. Instead of having to report the contents of all Confessions heard by a priest, the bill now only requires reporting on the contents of some Confessions he heard. For example, Chaplains in prisons would be allowed to respect the Confessional Seal if they heard the Confession of an inmate, but not of a prison guard or other prison worker. Chaplains at hospitals could anoint the sick and hear their Confessions, but they could not hear Confessions from doctors, nurses and other hospital staff without being required to report what they heard.

Even more alarming, priests could not hear Confessions from other priests without reporting the contents to law enforcement. Nor could they hear Confessions from their work colleagues at parishes, schools, colleges, Catholic Charities or any place else they worked without having to report the contents to law enforcement.

For the priest, it is a moral sin and could face Excommunication if he were to reveal the contents of a person's confession. In the past, priest have been tortured and given their lives rather than break their solemn vow to protect the Seal of Confession. That's how important it is.

The certainty of confidentiality and the knowledge that Confession is a sacred conversation with God encourages Catholics to seek out and receive God's Mercy.

Please tell your assembly members to protect the Seal of Confession.

### **IV. RESPECT FOR THE TRUTH**

**2488** *The right to the communication of the truth is not unconditional. Everyone must conform his life to the Gospel precept of fraternal love. This requires us in concrete situations to judge whether or not it is appropriate to reveal the truth to someone who asks for it.*

**2489** *Charity and respect for the truth should dictate the response to every request for information or communication. The good and safety of others, respect for privacy, and the common good are sufficient reasons for being silent about what ought not be known or for making use of a discreet language. The duty to avoid scandal often commands strict discretion. No one is bound to reveal the truth to someone who does not have the right to know it.*

**2490** *The secret of the sacrament of reconciliation is sacred, and cannot be violated under any pretext. "The sacramental seal is inviolable; therefore, it is a crime for a confessor in any way to betray a penitent by word or in any other manner or for any reason."*

## WHAT CONSTITUTES A CONCERN WORTH REPORTING?

Parents have a responsibility to report concerns they have about another person's behaviors or actions that could put their children — or any children — at risk. These concerns are anything that makes the parent uneasy or uncomfortable, or anything that a child reports made them feel uneasy or uncomfortable. Some examples of seemingly little things that can be worth reporting include: A teacher covering her glass classroom door with artwork, eliminating the ability to see into the classroom from the hall; a youth ministry icebreaker activity, where teens have to pass a mint candy from person to person using only toothpicks in their mouth, despite the discomfort of some participants. ## “PENTECOST” in the Catholic Catechism

731 On the day of Pentecost when the seven weeks of Easter had come to an end, Christ's Passover is fulfilled in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, manifested, given, and communicated as a divine person: of his fullness, Christ, the Lord, pours out the Spirit in abundance.

732 On that day, the Holy Trinity is fully revealed. Since that day, the Kingdom announced by Christ has been open to those who believe in him: in the humility of the flesh and in faith, they already share in the communion of the Holy Trinity. By his coming, which never ceases, the Holy Spirit causes the world to enter into the "last days," the time of the Church, the Kingdom already inherited though not yet consummated.

We have seen the true Light, we have received the heavenly Spirit, we have found the true faith: we adore the indivisible Trinity, who has saved us.
